In 2006, the Minnesota Chamber lists Transportation Funding and Efficiency as one of its priorities. David implied a constitutional amendment being considered for the ballot in this November's election relative to the state's Motor Vehicle Sales Tax, adding \$300M in highway funding is the most important issue facing us currently. This is a one time shot and if not passed, the legislature is clear that they will not consider this again. The Minnesota Chamber supports this ballot question, no matter what the final language specifics. Keep yourself informed. It sounds like this could be a very important vote.
