Because of the bond between humans and their pets, this business is definitely a people business!

Besides adoption, the society trains pet owners, provides spaying and neutering services, offers a pet loss support group, sponsors animal therapy services, and brings education about pets into area schools. Not all pets are healthy enough to be adopted, but all who are have no limit to their stay with the society. Cats are currently the most prevalent pet needing services by the society.
