With fast paced stacatto commentary, Lori Sturdevant engaged us immediately. Discussing many political topics we experienced a thought provoking and educational question and answer session. Summarizing how Minnesota held a leadership position among the 50 states throughout much of the last century through its bi-partisan efforts and state centered decision making, Lori challenged our current legislature to find its way out of the current quagmire of partisanship and focus on the needs of our future.

Education, transportation, and health care are the critical issues we face today. Even with a successful referendum this November for transportation funding, only a small portion of our future transportation needs will be met. A comprehensive plan using multiple funding sources is needed. Lori applauded our legislators who ask first, "What is good for Minnesota?", then choose their position on a vote. As the questions continued, each topic raised seem to come down to the same bottom line: Minnesotan's need to find a "right balance" in all political decisionmaking and that can only happen when partisanship is left behind.

Meals on Wheels, \$1,500

\$1,500, raised through our Harold Larson Party, was presented to **Laurie Brown, Meals on Wheels Coordinator**, by Diann Kirby today. Now located at St. Stephens Lutheran Church, 8400 France Ave South, Meals on Wheels is serving about 120 meals per day. Their new caterer is Lettuce Cater. Meals are provided to clients at \$3.75 per meal delivered to their doors by volunteers Monday thru Friday. Their clients are shut-ins or people who, for whatever reason, can not cook a basic meal for themselves.



Our funds will help provide a new service being added, the Emergency Meal Kit. Each kit will include a candy bar, a can of spaghetti, a can of vegetables and a fruit cup. Kits will be distributed closer to winter to each client they serve. Rotary members who would like to help put these kits together should call (952) 835-1665. They are looking to buy these items wholesale, so if anyone has any contacts in the grocery business, please let Meals on Wheels know.

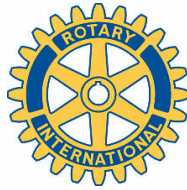

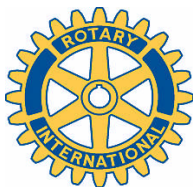
