Hello everybody....well, when I left I said I would try and send a monthly update on how I was doing....that didn't work out as well as planned, (there wasn't much time to use the internet during training at Ft. Dix.)

At any rate, here I am at Camp Buhring in Kuwait, we have been here for about a week doing a little training and getting ready to move north soon. Training at Ft. Dix was long, exhausting and at times quite pointless, however I did learn a lot and feel confident in the abilities of both myself and (more importantly) my team. After my unit "validated" at Ft. Dix I was able to come home for a few days in the week before Thanksgiving. It was great to spend time with my family and of course my wonderful girlfriend Anne.

Here is a breakdown of just what is going on with my deployment:

Rank: Sgt (E-5)

Position: Team Leader

Bravo Team, 3rd squad, 3rd Plt, 303rd MP co.

I have been designated as the aid and litter team for my squad during the deployment. Both myself and my team members have gotten extra first aid training from our Medic. Also I have put my team through many hours of aid and litter drills. Our job is to deal with any casualties or squad encounters, to include civilians and injured prisoners of war. This is an extremely important secondary job, and I have done my best to get as much training on it as I can.

Mission: I can't go into details about my mission as of yet. I want to again personally thank the officers and civilians of the Madison police department. All of the things I learned while interning for the department are MISSION CRITICAL, and will play a huge role in helping my squad to do our job. Everything from police procedure and IPC skills to data analysis and surveillance. All of it was great experience and will help me a lot. Thanks MPD!

Location: Until I get there I can't tell you where I am going in Iraq.....

Overall, I am doing great. I have made a lot of good friends in my unit and morale is generally high. Being away from home kinda sucks, but I know I will be back eventually...

Please feel free to respond to this e-mail and I can try and answer any questions you may have, or just say hello. Also feel free to forward it to any people who SHOULD be on my mailing list but got lost in the many transitions....!

NOTE from Carolyn:

We received a call about 2 AM this morning from Jack. He is now in Iraq, not yet at his final destination, but en route. Thanks again for everyone's kind thoughts and prayers for Jack and our family as we continue this long journey together. Carolyn
