“Governor Tim Pawlenty” -- Guests Welcome!

We open up 2008 with a January 7 Airport Hilton meeting at which **Governor Tim Pawlenty** will update us on what might be happening at the Capitol. Governor Tim Pawlenty was first elected governor in 2002. Pawlenty grew up in South St. Paul, Minnesota. The only child in his family to graduate from college, he attended the University of Minnesota and practiced law in the private sector. His public service career includes serving as a criminal prosecutor, Eagan City Councilmember, and ten-year member of the Minnesota House of Representatives, including four years as House Majority Leader.



This Week's Program

“Youth Venture” Guest: Jesse Ruth

Today, we heard about Youth Venture, an international organization that invests in young people, giving them skills to be change-makers in their communities. Jessie Ruth, their Partnership and Outreach Associate, enjoys her Americorps Vista Fellowship, inspiring youth and sharing their stories.

The Youth Venture motto, “Dream It. Do It.”, describes what their program is all about. Youth are encouraged to develop an idea, submit a work plan, receive approval then proceed to initiate and complete their plan. Youth Venture provides typically \$1,000 or so to the venture as seed money. Youth may turn that seed money into more money to fund their plan, or that may be all that is needed to complete the project. The Box City event at the capital, a Youth Venture idea, held by Kennedy and Jefferson High School students to raise awareness of homeless youth, has had an impact statewide.
