Our Recent Meeting... Film Making and a Chaska Rotary Film



Our speaker on September 8th was Gwen Briesemeister, a Documentary Filmmaker. Her career has included independent filmmaking, former gifted/talented coordinator, and video production instructor. She visited with us today to share about filmmaking and a special documentary that she has produced for Chaska Rotary Club. (Gwen is shown here with **President Kurt Hagen** and sister-in-law **Rotarian Jane Fenton**.)

Her documentary highlights the work that the Beyond New Beginnings program is doing to help young women with children to move from dependency to an independent living situation. Chaska Rotary is the sponsor of this pro-

gram. New Beginnings is a program of the Chaska Public Schools that works with young mothers while in school. Beyond New Beginnings helps women transition out of the school program and into independent living.

Gwen highlighted how Rotary connections made this program possible and how Chaska Rotarians volunteer to make this program successful. The program has a paid Director and a financial manager, most of the rest of the program relies on volunteers.

The picture at the right shows young mothers and their children who have been or are current participants in the program. Four families can be housed at a time. Participants can live there for up to two years. During that time they are given living skills that help them to become independent, like information on healthy nutrition, family safety, and gardening. Plus high schoolers come in to help babysit. They have a group family meal on Mondays and a Grandpa who comes in to visit and play with the children. All four of the original families have transitioned out to independent living situations today.



Gwen created her own production company 13 years ago and has been working on short independent documentary projects ever since. Her films focus on seemingly ordinary individuals with extraordinary stories. Two of her films are *Delano Heroes* and *Grin and Bear It*. Her films have received award recognition. Her current project is *Unraveling the Ribbon* about the Native American Ribbon Skirt. You can see the film *Beyond New Beginnings* on her website. 
