February 9th Preview: "Greater Twin Cities Youth Symphonies" Guest: Megen Balda, Executive Director



Megen Balda joined the Greater Twin Cities Youth Symphonies (GTCYS) in 2003 and has served as executive director since 2011. She leads strategic planning, fundraising, and program development, and oversees the daily operations of GTCYS' 38-member artistic and administrative staff, stewarding a \$2.7 million budget and multiple endowed funds.

Under her leadership, GTCYS has grown into the largest youth orchestra program in the United States. Enrollment has doubled, five new orchestras have been added, and Harmony—an El Sistema-inspired program for underrepresented youth—was created. In partnership with the Board of Directors, Megen ensures that GTCYS centers students, engages the community, and advances diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Megen will explore how GTCYS uses music as a powerful tool for student development, building confidence, discipline, and community while expanding access for students of all ages across our region. GTCYS provides young people with more than high-level music training—it offers belonging, leadership, and a place to grow. Please join us.

The jobseekers are all looking for a position that will fit their unique situation, whether it is only during school hours or when the baby is napping, or after the teenager leaves for college. The platform offers employers a chance to fill a temporary need or a full time position for a unique person with a certain talent.



also needed unique skills periodically. Her teenage daughter helped her develop a website where the employer can post their need and a potential worker can be matched with them. The employer pays a monthly fee to post their position. Bus Stop Mamas matches potential employees to the skills needed. The two are introduced and if a good match, a position is filled. They have temporary, part time and full time positions with the most common being an Administrative Assistant. The pool of employees includes highly skilled talent like lawyers, engineers, and doctors. 
